My name is Frank Hubert McAulay McKenzie. I was born in Guyana where I received my elementary and secondary school education. In 1972, I was admitted as an evening student at the University of Guyana and graduated in 1976 with a Bachelor of Arts degree majoring in Geography with a minor in Economics. During that time I served as an assistant teacher at Kingston Government School. Upon graduation, I acquired a job as a Government Social Development Research Officer where I worked for two years.

I emigrated to the United States of America in 1978 and pursued an academic career by enrolling the next year in the Master of Business Administration degree program at Long Island University, Brooklyn Campus, where I graduated *with distinction* in 1982.

Meanwhile, I worked as an Accountant and Accounting supervisor for two companies in New York, Brunschwig and Fils, Inc. and Control Data Corp. In 1984, I was licensed by the New York City Board of Education to teach Accounting and Business Practices in Day High Schools. Thereupon, I assumed a teaching position with the school system to teach Accounting, Business Management, and Mathematics classes from 1984 through 1989.

During my tenure with New York City Board of Education I took several graduate courses in Mathematics Education at Brooklyn College and City College to be certified by as a high school Mathematics teacher. In 1989, I moved with my family, wife and daughter, to the State of Georgia where I taught Mathematics at

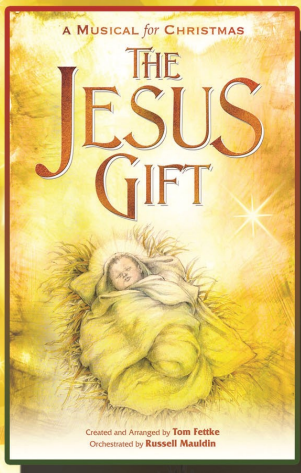
