WestCOP is a multimillion dollar, private not-for-profit, social service agency which operates community programs to combat poverty and its adverse effects in the Hudson Valley region of New York. Reverend Jerome served on its Board of Directors for over 19 years; he began his tenure on WestCOP's Policy Council, and then became the Council's Chair and Board Liaison. Due to his hard work and dedication, he was subsequently asked to serve as a full Board Member and eventually rose to the position of President of the Board.

Reverend Jerome is a loving husband and father of two children. He is married to Sheila S. Boston, Esq., a New York City law firm partner and a woman who loves the Lord; she serves as the Church Clerk at the Abyssinian Baptist Church in New York City. Together they have raised two wonderful, God-fearing children who are now young adults, Rome and Ariel Robinson. Rome is a Westchester County Corrections Officer and Ariel is a college student aspiring to become a registered nurse.

In summary, Reverend Jerome Robinson is a retired New York State Trooper who enlisted in the Army of the Lord, was licensed in the Army of the Lord, has been ordained in the Army of the Lord, and now proudly serves as a Commissioned Preacher of the Gospel in the Army of the Lord.



BIO. OF REVEREND JEROME ROBINSON

Reverend Jerome Robinson (also known as “Reverend Jerome”) or as his closest friends call him, “Reverend Red,” is an Associate Minister at Gospel Missionary Baptist Church in Harlem, New York City, where Bishop Henry L. Smalls is the Pastor. Reverend Jerome became an Ordained Minister on January 30, 2011, but he has a very long history of church service.

Reverend Jerome’s mother, Betty Robinson of Peekskill, New York, raised him in the church, and at an early age he started to play the drums in worship services.

As the drums became popular in religious circles, Rev. Jerome started his Conga Drum Ministry and played in churches all over Westchester County; his music ministry continued and eventually spread to the Central Hudson, Missionary, and Empire State Baptist Associations. Now, as an Associate Minister at Gospel Missionary Baptist Church, his music as well as preaching skills has expanded to yet other arenas.

In fact, Rev. Jerome has not only preached throughout the United States, but has also been blessed to preach in international venues as well. Reverend Jerome loves the Lord and loves to praise the Lord. He is often remembered by many for his conga and trumpet playing and for jumping up in a heartbeat to sing his favorite praise song, “I Love To Praise Him.” He encourages people to give whatever amount of talent God gave to them (great or small, a lot or a little) back to God. Reverend Jerome believes that “you don’t have to be the best of the best, you just have to give God your best.” and he doesn’t believe that you always have to “tell” people you love the Lord, but rather you need to “show” people that you love the Lord in the way in which you walk and in the way in which you talk, for “your actions will speak louder than your words.” He thus often proclaims: “Let the work I’ve done speak for me!”

Notably, Reverend Jerome is well known for dubbing himself as the official “Smile Collector”; he encourages people to let their light shine by trying to get them to smile – or, if that does not work, he tries to make them laugh as he is a comedian at heart. Reverend Jerome attended SUNY New Paltz College and is a retired New York State Trooper. He was on the New York State police force for over 12 years but had to retire due to an injury sustained on the job. Thereafter he continued to be very active in the community. He has been both a Boy Scout as well as Girl Scout leader;

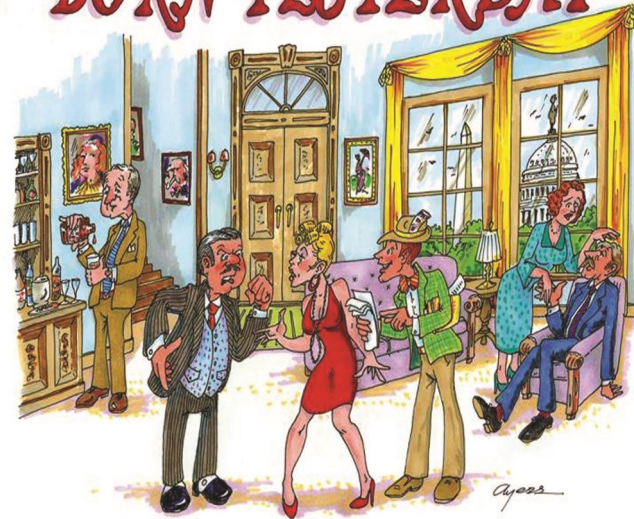
