### Arthritis

#### What is arthritis?

Arthritis is a joint disorder featuring inflammation. A joint is an area of the body where two different bones meet. A joint functions to move the body parts connected by its bones. Arthritis literally means inflammation of one or more joints. Arthritis is frequently accompanied by joint pain. Joint pain is referred to as **arthralgia**. When four or more joints are involved, the arthritis is referred to as **polyarthritis**. When two or three joints are involved, it is referred to as **oligoarthritis**. When only a single joint is involved, it is referred to as **monoarthritis**.
